The RAF Voyager, is an Airbus A330 jet and was re-purposed for use by the UK government in 2015, at a cost of £10m.

It was first used to take David Cameron and other ministers to the Nato summit in Poland in July 2016. At the time, the government defended the expenditure, saying it was cheaper than chartering flights and would save about £775,000 a year.





# British Values Individual Liberty

There may be times when we are judged, or opinions are formed based on our external appearance. It is important for us to think carefully about our own judgements and not to judge others solely on how they look.





**Confirm** – establish/state that something, that was believed or suspected, is true.

Impact – have a strong effect on someone or something.
Impression – an idea, feeling or opinion of someone or something. What you think they are like or what you think is going on.

Judge – to form an opinion or conclusion about someone or something.

Official – approved by the government or by someone in authority.

Represent – to act or speak on behalf of someone or something.
