police officer	a member of a police force : a person whose job is to enforce laws, investigate crimes, and make arrests
fire fighter	firefighter is a person who works at a fire department, either as a volunteer or by profession, who fights fires and rescues people and animals from fires
dentist	a person who is qualified to treat diseases and other conditions that affect the teeth and gums, especially the repair and extraction of teeth and the insertion of artificial ones
doctor	a person who is qualified to treat people who are ill
vet	a person with a medical degree trained to take care of the health of animals
nurse	a person trained to care for the sick or infirm, especially in a hospital
help	make it easier or possible for (someone) to do something by offering them one's services or resources
famous	known about by many people.
improvement	the action of improving or being improved.
hospital	an institution providing medical and surgical treatment and nursing care for sick or injured people
soldier	a person who serves in an army.
lamp	a device for giving light
war	a state of armed conflict between different countries or different groups within a country.

1805	Mary Seacole was born in Jamaica
1820	Florence Nightingale was born in Florence, Italy.
1824	The first fire service was formed in Edinburgh.
1853	Florence Nightingale qualifies and becomes a nurse.
1853	The Crimean War started.
1854	Florence Nightingale is asked by the government to take a group of nurses out to the Crimea to help at the Scutari hospital.
1859	Florence Nightingale releases her book 'Notes on Nursing'.
1860	St Thomas' Hospital and the Nightingale Training School for Nurses is opened by Florence Nightingale.
1865	Edith Cavell is born in Norfolk, England.

1907	Edith Cavell is asked to be in charge of a nurse training school in Brussels, Belgium.
1915	Edith Cavell dies after being arrested for treason.
1948	The NHS was founded.

farm	an area of land and its buildings, used for growing crops and rearing animals
tractor	a powerful motor vehicle with large rear wheels, used chiefly on farms for hauling equipment and trailers.
plough	a large farming implement with one or more blades fixed in a frame, drawn over soil to turn it over and cut furrows in preparation for the planting of seeds.
sowing	plant (seed) by scattering it on or in the earth.
harvesting	gather (a crop) as a harvest.
sickle	a short-handled farming tool with a semi-circular blade, used for cutting corn, lopping, or trimming.
industry	economic activity concerned with the processing of raw materials and manufacture of goods in factories.
source	a place, person, or thing from which something originates or can be obtained.
consumer	a person who purchases goods and services for personal use.
producer	a person, company, or country that makes, grows, or supplies goods or commodities for sale

Word	Meaning
continents	any of the world's main continuous expanses of land (Europe, Asia, Africa, North and South America, Australia, Antarctica)
countries	a nation with its own government, occupying a particular territory.
oceans	a very large expanse of sea, in particular each of the main areas into which the sea is divided geographically.
equator	a line notionally drawn on the earth equidistant from the poles, dividing the earth into northern and southern hemispheres and constituting the parallel of latitude 0°.
map	a diagrammatic representation of an area of land or sea showing physical features, cities, roads, etc.
world	the earth, together with all of its countries and peoples.
atlas	a book of maps or charts.
globe	a spherical representation of the earth or of the constellations with a map on the surface.
explorer	a person who explores a new or unfamiliar area.
evolution	the process by which different kinds of living organisms are believed to have developed from earlier forms during the history of the earth.
climate	the weather conditions prevailing in an area in general or over a long period.

1809	12 February - Charles Darwin is born.	
1818	Darwin joins Shrewsbury School after his mother dies in 1817	
1825	Darwin attends university in Edinburgh and studies medicine.	
1831 - August	Darwin receives an offer of a lifetime to join the HMS Beagle on a surveying journey to South America.	
1831 - December	Darwin joins Captain Fitzroy aboard the HMS Beagle and the voyage lasts five years and took him all around the world.	
1839	Darwin married Emma Wedgwood (his first cousin) and they went on to have 10 children.	
1859	Darwin publishes The Origin Of Species by Means of Natural Selection on 24th November	
1871	The Descent of Man is published.	
1872	The Expression of the Emotions is published.	
1881	Darwin publishes his last book.	
1882	19th April - Darwin dies.
