

Task 3 (Year 1/2)

Instead of writing an acrostic poem this week, nursery rhymes will be providing our poem structure.

Have a look at the first section of Five Little Speckled Frogs below.

Five little speckled frogs,
Sat on a speckled log,
Eating some most delicious bugs
Yum, Yum!

- How many lines are there?
- What punctuation is used? Where are the capital letters?
- Can you spot any rhyming words?
- Can you find any adjectives?

Using the same structure as Five Little Speckled Frogs, your task is to write a spring poem.

Here's an example for you.

Five little woolly lambs,
Ran from an angry ram,
Jumping across the lush, green fields,
Bounce, Bounce!

Using the vocabulary you collected yesterday, have a go at writing your own version of the first section of the nursery rhyme. If you're feeling confident, have a go at writing the next section and even continuing on with the nursery rhyme and starting with 'four'.

Remember, when you're writing your poems to use your best handwriting and you could even decorate your poems with some wonderful pictures and make it colourful too!
